





Andrzej has returned safely. He flew to Buenos Aires, meeting with Brothers there and then on to Ushuaia, Argentina. From Ushuaia he boarded a yawl to sail the double rounding of Cape Horn. Andrzej encountered winds of 58 knots (a summer breeze at the Cape) during the rounding and met with Chilean Brothers at Puerto Williams. Many thanks to our Argentinian and Chilean Brothers for their hospitality - all told quite an adventure!

In my Brotherhood Archives I have all the NY Table's typewritten notices, from 1960 to 1995, those pre-historic days. I have found the one that welcomed Andrzej to our Zaf on March 10, 1983.

Written by Scott Smith it says, "Andre was the navigator of a 35' steel yacht which he and 3 other Polish sailors were commissioned to deliver to Poland from Greece. Andre contacted the Palermo Table when they reached Sicily and they were given a royal welcome by the Italian Brothers. The French Brothers at Marseilles gave the crew another royal welcome. When they got to Gibraltar, they asked themselves why they should sail back to Poland. They bought navigational aids and food and sailed to Bermuda and then cleared for the U.S. Andre navigated direct to Port Elizabeth at night which aggravated the Coasties, who impounded the vessel and crew for a while...." the rest is history for our table.

#### OYSTERS, BURGERS AND DOGS ZAF


On Sunday, May 22 the New York Brothers and Captives had the pleasure of a Zaf at the home of Tony and Theo Olmer. The weather was good and we were able to be on the large porch and admire their garden and green lawn. Not the same as on the water but pretty close to it. As usual it was a gourmand's delight. Accompanying the tasty appetizers to salads to eclairs we were treated to local Long Island Sound oysters, burgers and hotdogs. And the wine flowed freely.

New York City may be known now as The Big Apple, but it could have been called The Big Oyster in the past. It surprises some that the oyster reigned supreme as the quintessential New York City food long before burgers, and hot dogs were known. City Island was famous for oysters and it was a local shipbuilder, Orrin Fordham, who 'invented' the concept of seeding and farming oysters starting in 1839. In the late 19<sup>th</sup> Century the oyster families on City Island would have been called what we call now, The One Percent.

Our Zaf oysters came from Norwalk, near the Olmer's home. Norm Bloom and Son LLC is a family owned farm that has been caring for, farming, and harvesting Copps Island Oysters, in Long Island Sound for over three generations.
